# **Summary**

- 1. This letter advises colleagues of the publication of Health Building Note/Scottish Hospital Planning Note (HBN/SHPN)40: Common activity spaces Volume 5: Scottish Appendix. With its publication, the Management Executive has completed the delivery of all outstanding guidance in the hospital planning note series.
- 2. HBN/SHPN 40 Volume 5 is the lead document for use in association with its Health Building Note (HBN) counterpart. It describes and illustrates amendments to the four volumes of HBN 40 to ensure that the HBN conforms to medical and nursing practices, statutory standards and references applicable in Scotland. An explanatory note under the heading "Contents" describes the scope of these amendments.
- 3. HBN 40 has been restructured and updated to reflect the latest thinking on common activity spaces in health buildings and to provide guidance on access provisions for disabled people to these buildings. The Note comprises four volumes giving guidance on activity spaces frequently occurring in common form in health buildings:

Volume 1 (Public areas) provides detailed ergonomic data on a variety of public spaces, and is related to information in Activity Data Sheets specifically prepared to complement this volume. It aims to provide the essential information with which the designer may produce the most effective and efficient solution for a particular project;

Volume 2 (Treatment areas) provides detailed ergonomic data on a variety of clinical and sanitary spaces and associated components, and is related to information in Activity Data Sheets specifically prepared to complement this volume;

Volume 3 (Staff areas) provides detailed ergonomic data on a variety of administrative and support spaces and associated components, and is related to information in Activity Data Sheets specifically prepared to complement this volume;

Volume 4 (Circulation areas) deals with internal horizontal and vertical hospital circulation and communication spaces (ie corridors, lifts and stairs). It provides guidance on the planning and design of traffic routes both within and between hospital departments. Particular emphasis is given to the space requirements for the movement of people, goods and equipment.

### General

4. A copy of HBN/SHPN 40 Volume 5: Scottish Appendix and a copy of each of the four volumes which comprise its counterpart HBN 40 are enclosed as a matched set for your information and use. Further copies can be purchased from The Stationery Office.

### Action

5. Colleagues are invited to consider this guidance when briefing and planning hospital projects.

# **Further Information**

- 6. The previous issue of Scottish Hospital Planning Note (SHPN) 40 was published in 1992 and referred only to the two volumes of HBN 40 published in 1985 and the two volumes published in 1988. It is not applicable to the 1995 version of HBN 40.
- 7. The Estates Environment Forum is currently considering the future of planning guidance, the responsibility for which passed from the Management Executive to the Forum on 1 April 1996.
- 8. A comprehensive list of extant guidance in the Scottish Hospital Planning Note series is attached at Annex 1.

- 9. Colleagues' attention is also drawn to the availability of HBN 36 Volume 1: Local Healthcare Facilities and Volume 2: Case Studies. Although these have not been issued to The Scottish Health Service, in the absence of corresponding Scottish-specific primary care briefing and planning guidance these documents have the general support of the Management Executive as a source of valuable information. They do not include references to other publications relevant to the Scottish Health Service, eg to "The Building Standards (Scotland) Regulations 1990". Such differences, if acknowledged, do not detract from the usefulness of the Notes as guidance.
