
COMMISSIONING CANCER SERVICES IN SCOTLAND: PRIMARY AND PALLIATIVE CARE SERVICES: JANUARY 1997

Summary

- 1. The report "Commissioning Cancer Services in Scotland: Primary and Palliative Care Services" to the Chief Medical Officer from the Commissioning Cancer Services Sub-Committee of the Scottish Cancer Co-ordinating and Advisory Committee was issued for consultation in November 1996. The responses have since been considered by the sub-committee and have been taken into account in the preparing the revised report which is enclosed.
- 2. In general the report was warmly welcomed. Comments were received from a wide range of health service, professional and voluntary bodies involved in the care of patients with cancer, whose contributions provided an invaluable additional dimension to this final report, dated January 1997.

Action

- 1. Health Boards and Trusts are asked to consider the general principles and in particular the Action Points set out in this report against the background of the original framework of objectives and milestones for the reconfiguration of cancer services set out in NHS MEL(1996)54.
- 2. In this context purchasers should draw up plans taking on board the specific Action Points required to address the need to integrate primary and palliative care services within the overall framework for the provision of cancer services.
- 3. Successful implementation of the report's action points depends on effective multi-disciplinary, inter-disciplinary and inter-agency team working. Particular emphasis is placed on the need for rapid and effective communications between and among all care sectors and at all levels of care, including, importantly, communications with patients and their relatives/carers.
