SE/STUC PROTOCOL ON STAFFING MATTERS IN PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS – GUIDANCE ON SCOPING OF SERVICES AND IN-HOUSE BIDS

- 1. We have received various queries round the interpretation of the guidance note within the NHS, and in particular around the issue of soft FM services.
- 2. The information note records (early in 2003 when the guidance was produced) that in all known cases so far where contracts have been signed, cleaning has been included within the scope of the PPP. It also sets out some of the issues which need to be addressed by organisations which wish to examine the potential for solutions other than the standard PPP precedent. It should not be read as in any sense an instruction to organisations to include these services within PPP contracts, although that of course is one option.
- 3. The guidance describes approaches which allow choice, subject to important wider PPP considerations. One such approach is to conduct a best value review of the provision of soft FM services in the context of the PPP project. Any such review of course has to take place under full partnership working. Such a review needs to consider both the quality and the cost of services, and to take account of the impact of different models of service provision on the allocation of risk between prospective PPP contractors and the NHS. While this process is going on, all options for the provision of soft FM services need to be kept in play.
